


# Party preferences






## RESULTS


- In August, the balance of power between the parties changed within the margin of error. The Tisza Party leads over Fidesz-KDNP by 4 percentage points among the total population, by 5 percentage points among party voters, and by 6 percentage points among committed party voters. The score is 30-26 among the total population, 39-34 among party voters, and 41-35 among committed party voters, in favor of Péter Magyar's party. The ranking of the parties has not changed, but Fidesz-KDNP's disadvantage has decreased within the margin of error. At the end of the summer, the governing parties more or less dominated public discourse, and voter engagement among their supporters was slightly higher than it had been at the beginning of the summer.



- Support for Mi Hazánk increased within the margin of error, by 2-2-2 percentage points among the entire population, party voters, and committed party voters, to 6, 8, and 8 percent, respectively. They would currently be elected to parliament.



- DK would receive 5% of the total population's vote and 7% of party voters and committed voters, meaning that the party would once again exceed the parliamentary threshold.
- Support for MKKP remains unchanged, and they would still get into parliament in August with 4-6-6 percent support. It is clear that there is demand for politics beyond Tisza and Fidesz, so far they have not managed to narrow it down to a two-party political race.
- There has been no significant change in support for smaller parties.



- The proportion of undecided voters has fallen by 3 percentage points since July, to 24 percent. Two percent of the total population would vote for other parties not included in the list.

There was no major shift in voter preferences over the summer, with voters largely settling on their party choices. Regardless, in such a close race, with three other parties besides the two major political forces hovering around the parliamentary threshold, there is cause for excitement. After many long months, Fidesz-KDNP has managed to gain a foothold, and the campaign atmosphere is sure to intensify from September onwards.

**Methodology:** Methodology: The survey was conducted between August 21 and 27, 2025, with 1,000 respondents interviewed by telephone. The survey is representative of the adult population of the country in terms of gender, age, educational attainment, and type of settlement. The margin of error is +/- 3.5%.
