




## RESULTS


In October, the **Tisza** Party is ahead of **Fidesz-KDNP** by 6 percentage points among the entire population, 30 percent would vote for Péter Magyar's party. TISZA has gained 2 percentage points among the party voters, resulting in an 8-percentage-point lead over the current government parties, making the score 43-35. 44 percent of the decided voters would vote for Tisza, 34 percent for Fidesz, thus Tisza is leading by 10 percentage points, raising its advantage by 2 percentage points since September. All these changes fall within the margin of error. The survey was closed before the rallies on the 23rd of October, their effects is not yet reflected in the results. So far it seems that this autumn Péter Magyar and his team are in a comfortable situation, regardless of Fidesz's strong moments during the summer, Tisza has managed to keep its leading position for months by now.




- **Mi Hazánk (Our Homeland)** remains the third strongest party, its support however has reduced in October within the margin of error, 5 percent of the overall population, 6 percent of the party voters and 7 percents of the decided voters would cast their ballots in the party's favour.



- Kutyapárt (MKKP or Two Tailed Dog Party)** has strengthened during the month within the margin of error, and so it is sharing its position on the podium with Mi Hazánk, with their support standing on 5 and 6 percents. 6 percents of the decided voters would vote for MKKP in October, this result would currently allow them to come out victorious in a race to join the Parliament, however this result is way too close to be certain, it is on the verge, right at the threshold.



- **DK's** support has not changed in October, 4 percent of the entire population, and 5 percent of both the party voters and the decided voters would vote for them. It remains unclear whether they make it to the Parliament.



- No significant change has occurred in the support of smaller parties. As per our current knowledge, neither the politicians of Momentum nor those of LMP are

running for the 2026 elections, as such, in October we have stopped following the level of their support.

- 1-3 percent of the responders would vote for other parties. In October, the ratio of decided voters has fallen by 6 percentage points, while the ratio of those who will definitely stay away from the ballot boxes has risen by 4 percentage points. The ratio of undecided voters rose further, by 2 percentage points to a total of 31 percents.
- The brutal campaigns are shaking voters' confidence. The latest attacks launched by the government parties against Péter Magyar on social media could cause some less committed Tisza supporters to shy away from the elections. At the same time, Fidesz-KDNP's particularly ruthless communication strategies might also make some of their own uncertain voters question their choice. It is still far too early to tell how Fidesz-KDNP's increasingly aggressive approach will affect the overall party support. Over the past two months, the Tisza camp has proven relatively stable, but with the campaigns now gaining momentum, it is clear that voters are becoming uncomfortable with the increasingly hostile atmosphere. If MKKP manages to stay above the 5 percent threshold in the coming months, the party could finally dispel the myth of "wasted votes" that has haunted it since its founding—and even challenge Mi Hazánk, which has maintained its position on the podium for months.

**Methodology:** The research was conducted between October 16 and October 22 of 2025, through surveying 1,000 people by telephone. The research is representative of the adult population of the country by gender, age, level of education, and type of settlement. Margin of error: +/- 3,5%.
