




## RESULTS


Two weeks before the election, Tisza has gained ground within the margin of error, widening its lead over Fidesz-KDNP. Péter Magyar's party leads Fidesz-KDNP by 6 percentage points among the general population, with the score at 37-31. Among party voters and definite party voters, Tisza leads by 9 percentage points, with the score at 49-40 in both cases. The similar results among definite voters and party voters suggest that the two parties' camps mobilized their supporters to nearly the same extent; in this sense, Fidesz successfully reached out to its own supporters, but its camp is fundamentally smaller than Tisza's.




If the election were held this Sunday, a three-party parliament would be formed. Although Mi Hazánk stands at only 4 percent of the total population, it stands at 5 percent among party voters and among voters who are certain to vote for a party, meaning it would just make it into parliament. The party's support has declined within the margin of error, while the gravitational pull of the two major parties has increased in the home stretch.



The MKKP stands at 3 percent of the total population and at 4 percent among both party voters and certain voters, just below the threshold for entering parliament.



DK is at 2 percent in all polls and is currently not approaching the threshold for entering parliament.



The proportion of undecided voters remains at 23 percent. 78 percent of respondents say they would definitely vote in the election, 9 percentage points more than in February. Although self-reported turnout is always higher than actual turnout on election day, we can still expect an exceptionally high, near-record turnout on April 12.

**Methodology:** The survey was conducted via telephone interviews with 1,000 respondents between March 23 and 26, 2026. The survey is representative of the country’s adult population in terms of gender, age, educational attainment, and type of settlement. The margin of error is +/- 3.5%.
