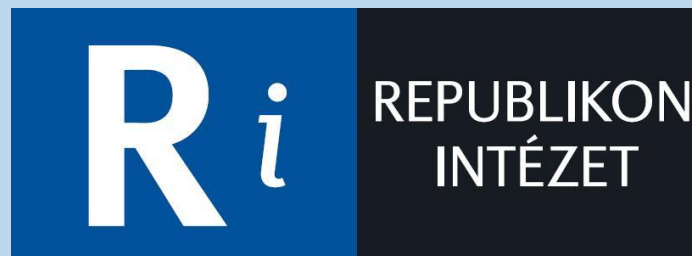


# PARTY AFFILIATION APRIL 2021

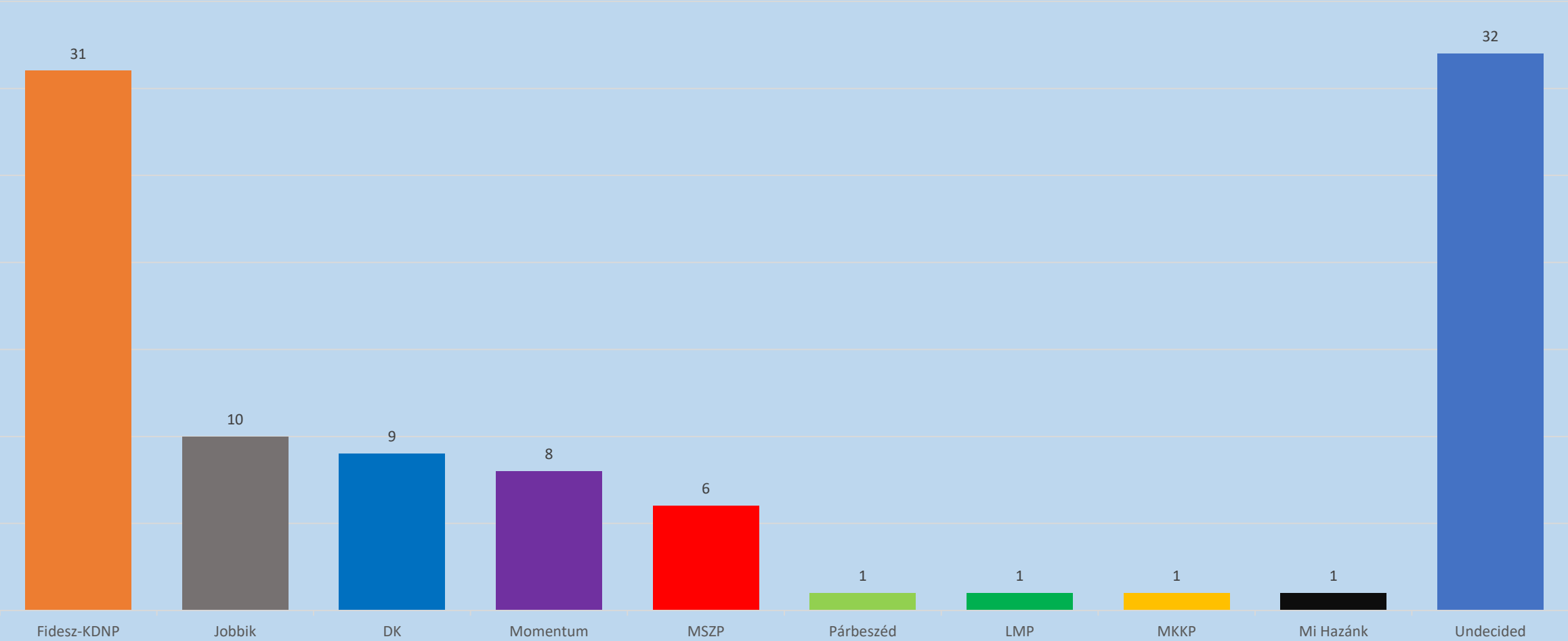


# About the survey

- Survey data:
  - Telephone survey with 1000 respondents
  - Representative of population aged 18+ (by age, gender, geography and level of education)
  - Margin of error: +/- 3,2%
- The survey was conducted between 19th and 23rd April, 2021

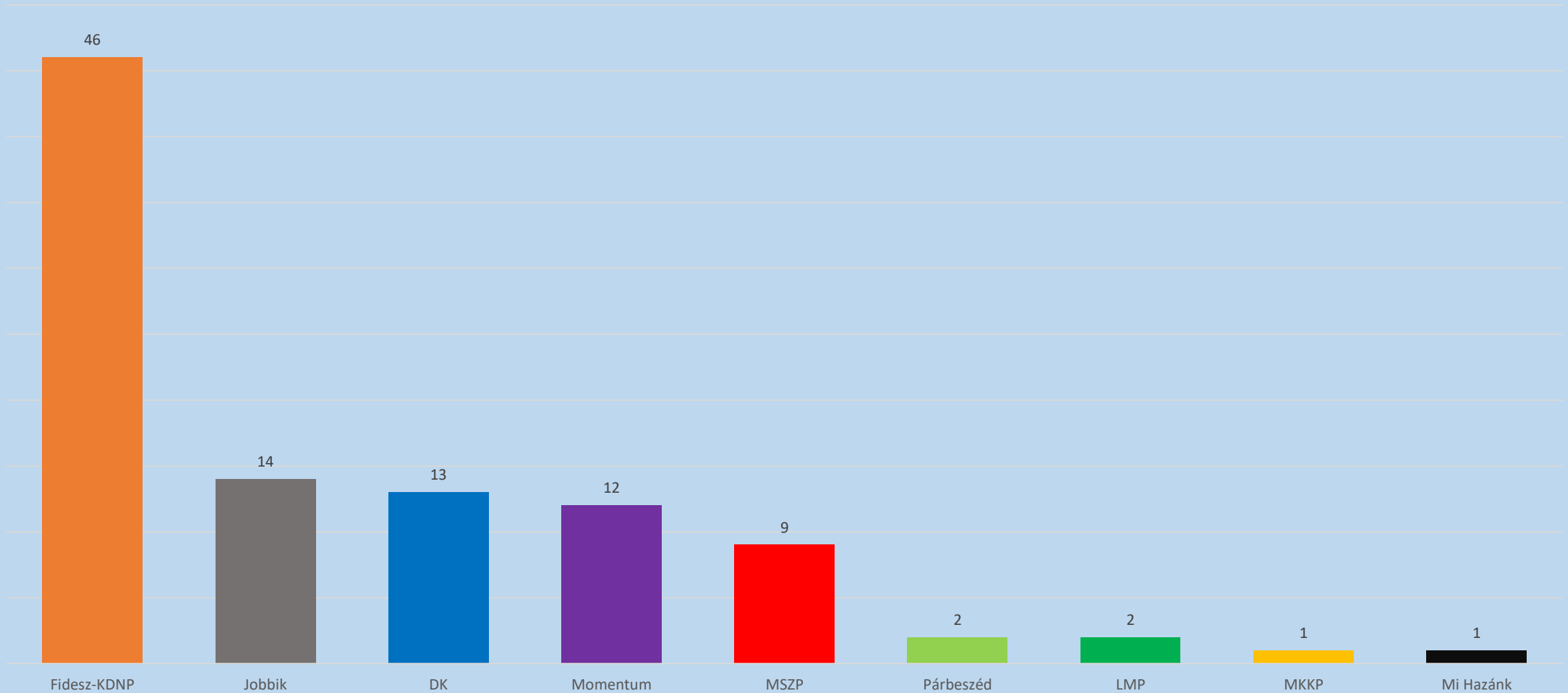
# Total population

- Fidesz-KDNP support rose by 2 percentage points in April, among the total population and 1 percentage point among party voters, to 31 percent among the total population and to 46 percent among party voters. Jobbik gained 1 percentage point, now having 10 percent among the total population. DK and MSZP support did not change among the total population, they stand at 9 percent and 6 percent, while Momentum lost 1 percentage point; 8 percent of the total population would vote for them. They are followed by the Párbeszéd, MKKP, LMP and Mi Hazánk all account for 1-1 percent of the total population. 32 percent of the total population is undecided in contrast to the 34 percent in March.
- Fidesz and Jobbik also gained 1 percentage point of their support among party voters, standing at 46 and 14 percent in April. DK and Momentum have both lost 1 percentage point among party voters, currently standing at 13 percent and 12 percent. MSZP support remains unchanged with 9 percent. Support for Párbeszéd, LMP remained unchanged at 2 percent, as well as support for MKKP and Mi Hazánk, who both have 1 percent.
- Overall, support for opposition parties has changed only slightly; only Jobbik was able to grow in April, as we have already observed in March. The reason for this success may be the strong political role of Péter Jakab.
- The Fidesz has strengthened among both the total population and the party's voters, though only slightly - this is not entirely surprising when you consider worries about the vaccination/pandemic situation.

- Opposition coalition remains stronger than Fidesz-KDNP among the general population (35-31 percent) and among party voters (52-46 percent).
- **Methodology:** The research was conducted by telephone interviewing 1,000 people between March 18-25. The research is representative of the adult population of the country by gender, age, education and type of settlement.
